Hi Mr Vautaret,

I acknowledge receipt of your email.

Regarding the boat incident,

After the owner who suffered the incident informed me of the situation, we viewed the video of the harbour entrance. We noted the arrival of 2 units shortly before 1am on 23 July. According to the description of the boat that hit the owner's boat, it was a black and clear bi-colour semi-rigid, equipped with a white engine and folded bimini, 4 people on board, excessive speed at this point. It should be noted that it is however very difficult to define a good description because of the visibility at this time. Nevertheless, after some eliminations, without any unit coming out of the basin, it would be a harbour boat.

Although there was no material damage, Mr "B" who suffered the incident had already made the same analysis (following the noise of the impact he had been able to stand up and see the boat moving away).

[To tell you the facts that reached me, Mr "B" tried to discuss with the skipper of the boat that was apparently at fault...but the latter bitterly denied the situation].

As regards the video protection equipment, and the legislation relating to it

the camera itself is of good quality. When the lighting conditions are not bad, we can almost determine the faces of people passing on the bridge (which we are not allowed to do...).

You could come to the harbour master's office to see what it was like.

To date we are using a remote screen which we recognise, as we have discussed, that the resolution is not of good definition. This is best seen when we connect a mobile device to it. Anyway,

about equipping the port with more cameras... technically, it would be very difficult (no network pulled, retransmission problem, connections), but legally it is not possible (public domain too close to houses...).

After having had to move it to a private area with a lesser field of vision and sharpness, we were authorised to put the current camera at the corner of the harbour master's office in order to ensure "security" at the entrance/exit of the pool.

At this stage we cannot do anything more on this subject.
